- **Aytzim: Ecological Judaism** (<https://aytzim.org>) – A well-resourced website with collections of materials ranging from educational (curricula and lesson plans) to recommendations for books, audio, video, and much more, all on the topic of environmentalism and Judaism. Aytzim is run by Green Zionist Alliance, a nonprofit organization focused on our special responsibility as Jews to tend to Israel's environment. Aytzim is also the online home of Shomrei Breishit: Rabbis & Cantors for the Earth.
- **Canfei Nesharim.** (<http://canfeinesharim.org>) An educational blog aimed at “sustainable living inspired by Torah.” Although aimed largely at the Orthodox community, the website is rich with resources related to Judaism, nature, and the environment, including holiday guides and nature-focused commentaries on each weekly Torah portion.
